## **ARE YOU AWARE...**

 Stevens-Johnson Syndrome (SJS) and its more severe form Toxic Epidermal Necrolysis (TEN) are very serious skin reactions.
These may be caused by commonly used medications which include ANTIBIOTICS, ANTIEPILEPTICS, HIV treatments and some over the counter medicines such as IBUPROFEN.

• 1 in 4 patients who develop TEN die from the reaction because of its severity.

### KNOW THE SIGNS BE AWARE WHEN TO REFER

#### Initial symptoms may be non-specific and may include:

• Mild Skin Rash • Fever • Malaise • Flu-like symptoms

#### These could be followed by more severe symptoms:

- Blistering rash to variable percentage of the body.
- Blisters to the mouth, eyes, ears, nose, genital area.
  - Swelling of eyelids and itchy, red eyes.

## SYMPTOMS CAN VERY QUICKLY BECOME LIFE THREATENING!

Recognition of the early symptoms of SJS/TEN, accurate diagnosis



and prompt medical attention are the most invaluable tools in minimising the possible long-term effects.
